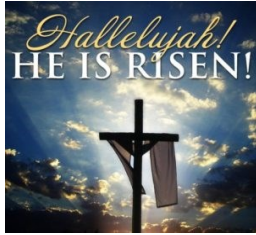

Breakfast with Jesus

Both of our readings today contain examples of repentance. In the gospel of John we see how Jesus restores Peter to the community of disciples and repairs their relationship. Peter had denied Jesus out of terror of imminent mortal peril. He knew that in denying Jesus, he had also denied himself.

Saul's repentance was a very different matter: light became dark, down became up: there was a complete reversal of his priorities and his identity.

Sometimes we are called back to what we already know. But sometimes we are called out into unfamiliar territory, as certainties turn themselves upside-down, and the world is not what it seems...

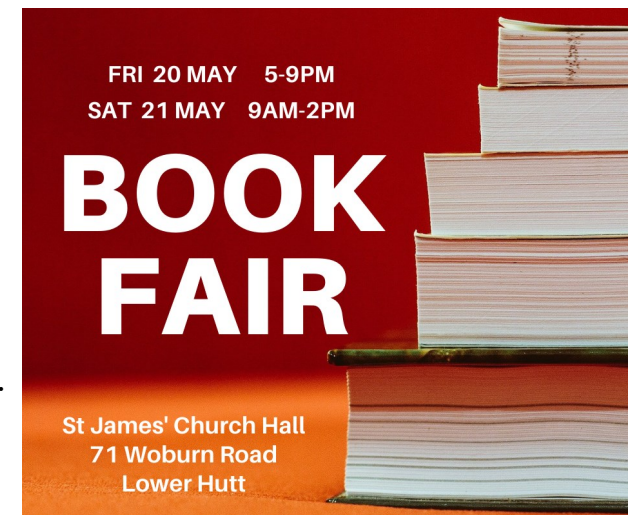

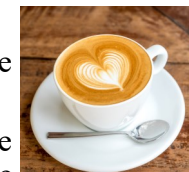
TODAY
