THE NEXT STEP - HALL REDEVELOPMENT

As you will be aware the Hall Redevelopment Committee is currently tasked with producing a feasibility study on the options available to upgrade the Parish Hall.

Contributions from individual Parishioners will be a vital part of our Hall Upgrade Project. To help secure a Lotto grant, we must demonstrate an ability to provide a third of the funds ourselves – the more we raise, the more we can request from Lotto. The Fundraising Team wish to request a personal meeting with some members of our congregation to discuss whether they would like to make a pledge. The team appreciate that some parishioners may not be comfortable about a personal approach, so encourage anyone who would prefer not to be approached in this way to contact the Parish Office, preferably via email to reception@stjames.net.nz. Their decision will be respected and kept confidential to the Parish Administrator, Wardens, Priest in Charge and the Fundraising Team. The team may also circulate general emails to parishioners, sent from the Parish Office to preserve privacy, seeking financial support. A pledge is all that is being sought at this time until such time as an option from the feasibility study is approved by a general meeting of the Parish.
