

Kia kaha te whānau is a new vestry sub-committee. It means to keep the family strong. Our symbol of the 'Tree of many hands' represents all our different types of families, the different places we worship, but with all being connected and bound by the love of Christ.



This enthusiastic and dedicated sub-committee is comprised of Laura Pemberton, Liz Friend, Rosy Moar and Meredith Perry (vestry member).

The purpose of the Kia kaha te whānau is to assist the Anglican Parish of Lower Hutt i.e. St James and All Saints) Vestry by supporting the development of new, and strengthening of existing, church activities that nurture the spiritual growth of all young people up to the age of 21 and their whānau. These may consist of activities for those who are currently church members and outreach to the community. Whānau, for the purpose of this committee, is defined as 'physical, emotional and spiritual connections between a collective' as we recognise that whānau consists of different groupings of individuals with various types of relationships. We also recognise that some people may come to the church to find whānau. All activities will have core values of:

- a. Supporting a life of spiritual growth
- b. Being diversity inclusive
- c. Being physically, psychologically, and spiritually safe

We are seeking feedback from people (from our very youngest to our most senior) on the current activities we provide to keep our family strong AND what other activities we could initiate – both internal and outreach activities.

We will also have poster boards in each church, with an envelope for anonymous feedback. The envelopes will remain in place for 2 weeks. ROYALTY AND THE BELLS OF ST JAMES

In December, 1953, our church was dedicated. Less than a month later, when Queen Elizabeth the Second and the Duke of Edinburgh were visiting Lower Hutt, the ringing of the bells welcomed them to the church. In 1958, at the request of Mayor Percy Dowse, the bells were rung to welcome the Queen Mother to our city (she didn't visit the church).

Last year, the bells were played on Monday (6 June) for the Queen's Birthday Observance, on Friday 9 September as a celebration of the life of Queen Elizabeth the Second and on Sunday 25 September before the Music & Rosemary Concert to which people were invited to Come & Reflect on the Life of Her Majesty the Queen. Next Saturday, to mark the Coronation of King Charles the Third, the bells of St James will be rung; Les Baird and myself will – separately – play the bells. Beginning just before 12 noon with the playing of the Westminster Chime, the tunes will include "God Save the King", hymns and peals.

The bells will be played for more than 10 minutes. If you live close to Woburn Road, you will, of course, hear the bells loud and clear. The church will be open and everyone is invited to come along to listen to the bells. If you can't come along to St James and live near St Paul's Waiwhetu, around midday, you will be able to hear Malcolm Freebairn playing the bells at that Church. **G Ross**
