
The Anglican Parish of Lower Hutt St James' and All Saints' Churches May 14th 2023 Mothers Day- 6th Sunday of Easter

Coronation Tree Planting

Last Sunday, a tree was planted outside the library to commemorate the Coronation of King Charles III.

As part of the ceremony the Rev Murray Wills was asked to say a karakia. Murray said "it was a wonderful occasion to be part of and the Mayor paid tribute during the ceremony to the special relationship that we have with Council in sharing our locations". Children from SS Peter and Paul and a Kia Group were asked to play an official part in the ceremony, and this will create memories for them in years to come.

Kia kaha te whānau is a new vestry sub-committee. It means to keep the family strong. Our vision is kua paiheretia tātou ki te aroha o te Karaiti - We are bound by the love of Christ and we are seeking ways to ensure that our young people and families have opportunities for spiritual growth. Our symbol of the 'Tree of many hands' represents all our different types of families, the different places we worship, but with all being connected and bound by the love of Christ.



This enthusiastic and dedicated sub-committee is comprised of Laura Pemberton, Liz Friend, Rosy Moar and Meredith Perry (vestry member).

The purpose of the Kia kaha te whānau is to assist the Anglican Parish of Lower Hutt i.e. St James and All Saints) Vestry by supporting the development of new, and strengthening of existing, church activities that nurture the spiritual growth of all young people up to the age of 21 and their whānau. These may consist of activities for those who are currently church members and outreach to the community. Whānau, for the purpose of this committee, is defined as 'physical, emotional and spiritual connections between a collective' as we recognise that whānau consists of different groupings of individuals with various types of relationships. We also recognise that some people may come to the church to find whānau. All activities will have core values of:

- a. Supporting a life of spiritual growth
- b. Being diversity inclusive
- c. Being physically, psychologically, and spiritually safe

We are seeking feedback from people (from our very youngest to our most senior) on the current activities we provide to keep our family strong AND what other activities we could initiate – both internal and outreach activities.

People will have the opportunity to chat to Rosy or Meredith after their church service on the 7th of May, 2023 and with Laura and Liz after the 10am service on the 14th of May. We will also have poster boards in each church, with an envelope for anonymous feedback. The envelopes will remain in place for 2 weeks.
