Lower Hutt Foodbank Financial donations welcome

The Foodbank's emergency food parcels provide short term relief, with groceries for around four days.

It costs about \$12,000 per month to operate the Foodbank - 67% of this amount is used to buy food for our parcels and the remainder is spent on our rent and power, the salary of our parttime Service Coordinator, and other operational expenses.

We rely on donations and grants because we do not receive direct funding from central or local government.

The Lower Hutt Community Foodbank is registered as a charitable entity (CC25676). All donations qualify for tax credits and receipts are issued in July after the end of their tax year.

Opening Session – Sunday 9 March, 2-4pm at **All Saints' Church, Belmont**. During this session, Kathy will lead us through the ways of praying that we'll use during the retreat, and distribute a list of passages to pray with during the first days of the retreat.

Weekly one-on-one meetings with Kathy to talk through your prayer for the previous week and be given passages to pray with during the week to come. Meeting times and locations will be arranged to be mutually suitable for each person and Kathy. The one-on-one meetings allow Kathy to make each person's retreat suit their own situation and relationship with God.


Closing Session: Sunday 6 April 2-3.30pm in the Church.

A Morning of Connection at Wellington City Mission's Whakamaru

The Anglican Centre team experienced the transformative spirit of Wellington City Mission's Whakamaru during a recent team building visit.

More than just the Mission's headquarters, Whakamaru stands as a testament to inclusive community design, housing a social supermarket, chapel, medical centre, vibrant café hub, meeting spaces, and 35 transitional housing units under one welcoming roof.

Wellington City Missioner Murray Edridge shared his compelling vision for Whakamaru, explaining its foundational principle: "There is no us and them." This philosophy comes to life in Craig and Gail's, the ground-floor café where people from all walks of life gather.

"Some come to Whakamaru because they need something, some come to offer something," Murray explains. "Craig and Gail's is where we can sit at the same table, rub shoulders, and share each other's company."

Upon its opening, Te Ati Awa gifted the mission the Te Reo name, Hei Whakamaru o te Korowai o te Panepane o te Ika a Maui, meaning 'The shelter of the cloak of protection of the wider Wellington region,' which beautifully captures its purpose. As Murray emphasizes, "Everyone who comes into this space will be a distinguished guest. Whether you come because there's something you need or something to offer, you will be treated the same. Together, we build community."

Drawing inspiration from Fr Gregory Boyle's teachings on radical mutuality and universal goodness, the Mission weaves these principles into their daily work. Bishop Anashuya Fletcher reinforced this message through the biblical metaphor of the body, highlighting our fundamental interconnectedness: "Despite our titles, we cannot do without each other. We all contribute to the success of each other and are reliant on one another to thrive."

The morning concluded with Archdeacon Gendy Thomson leading a Strengths session, celebrating the diverse talents within the team and exploring how these gifts energize and shape their understanding of the world.
