
Easter is a time for new beginning and that means we are on a count down to see stage one of the Community Hall redevelopment move towards completion. The build time has extended more recently due to a delay in receipt of sign off from the Council for the northwest corner that presented an unforeseen challenge.

Many of you have asked about progress and when you will have the opportunity to see the completed project. While PDAT (a subcommittee of vestry) is the team that has worked with White Construction on all the details there are other teams involved.

We are getting ready to manage the transition of a hand over from the contractor and a building site to possession by the Parish. This involves Property, Technology as well as the Admin subcommittees - there are key things that need to be done for it to be operational.





Lenten Study Review

Our group of seven retirees and leader Rev. Catherine Froud met in the chapel 1-2pm for six Tuesdays before Easter 2025.

Each week we took turns reading and discussed this year's Lent study by Rev (now Bishop) Dr Anne van Gend, *Restoring the Story: The Good News of Atonement*. The study booklet is based on Anne's 2024 print and e-book of the same name (SCM Press, UK). Thank you, Catherine, for your helpful engagement with the study and for keeping us on track and to time.

Bishop Dr Anne van Gend chose four different scriptural stories of atonement (at-onement): sacrificial atonement, victorious atonement, covenantal atonement, and theosis. Her friendly, and almost conversational style drew this listener/reader in. Deep down I had become uncomfortable with how I might relate my long understanding of the Easter story to today's world, and across an age span. And how could I really describe mystery? I was still moved by Easter's immeasurability in height, depth and circumference.

Our study reviewed how historical understandings of atonement have often reflected church culture, histories, and controversies of the past 2000 years. That doesn't mean all atonement understandings have moved away from the Biblical narratives. The Jesus of the Bible is central to atonement. Bishop Dr Anne van Gend pictures two parallel fences as boundary limits and concludes there is ample room between those boundaries for different Bible stories to describe atonement in ways relevant to us, and to our world today. There is work to do.

It's an exciting challenge. I've now purchased Anne's (2024) book.

John and I usually attend Te Kakano o Te Aroha, the Wellington Presbyterian Māori Pastorate, a 3 minute walk from our Moerā home. When Te Kakano o Te Aroha closes mid-December to February, we walk the river bank to St James, and on other occasions in between. Thank you for your welcome.
